



Open the Linphone App


You will have multiple windows popping up asking questions:

Allow Microphone - Must Allow


Allow Notifications - Must Allow

Allow Photos - Up to you


DO NOT Allow Contacts (these are your cellphone contacts)




If all goes well you should be connected BUT in most cases your connection will fail - but there is a trick.

As you try to connect, you will notice there is a window requesting Authentication that pops up but doesn't stay up long enough for you to even read. You have to enter your password here in order to connect properly but you can't get to the window to do it.

The Trick: In order to keep the Authentication Window open, go to the keypad and dial a phone number (any number will do). The window requesting Authentication Needed will stay up - input the password (provided by Bill) and click "Confirm password".





The dot next to the word Connected in the upper left corner should now magically turn green. Voilà! You are connected!
